## Known commonly as Palm Sunday Jesus enters Jerusalem riding on a colt. Matt 21:1-11, Mark 11:1-11, Luke 19:28-44, John 12:12-19

Jesus drives out the money changers and people who were selling animals at the Temple. Matt 21:12-17, Mark 11:15-19, Luke 19:45-48, John 2:13-17

Tuesday

Jesus and his disciples pass the withering fig tree and Jesus teaches again on faith. Mark 11:20-26 The religious leaders challenge Jesus' authority at the temple, hoping to arrest him. Matt 21:23-32, Luke 20:1-21:36 Jesus goes to the Mount of Olives where Jesus teaches about the end times. Matt 24, Mark 13, Luke 21:5-36 **, Uh** 

### Tuesday



It is speculated that Jesus may have spent the day resting in Bethany, perhaps at the home of His friends Mary and Martha. In addition, it is believed Judas agreed to betray Jesus on this day, which is sometimes referred to as "Spy Wednesday."

Matthew 26:14-16, Luke 22:1-6

#### Thursday

Jesus sends Peter and John ahead to Jerusalem to prepare for the Passover Feast. Matt 26:17-19, Mark 14:12-16, Luke 22:7-13 After sunset, Jesus washes his disciples' feet as they prepare to share the Passover meal John 13:3-11



Thursday (continued)

- Jesus predicts one of his disciples will betray him.
- Matt 26:20-25, Mark 14:17-21, Luke 22:21-23, John 13:18-30
- Jesus established the Lord's Supper or Communion, asking His followers to always remember His sacrifice by partaking of bread (His Body) and wine (His blood)
- Matt 26:26-29, Mark 14:22-25, Luke 22:14-20

#### Thursday (continued)

**Jesus predicts Peter's denial** Matt 26:31-35, Mark 14:27-31, Luke 22:31-34, John 13:36-38 Jesus and disciples walk to the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus prays in anguish Math 26:36-46, Mark 14:32-42, Luke 22:39-46 Judas betrays Jesus with a kiss and our Lord is arrested by the Sanhedrin. Matt 26:47-56, Mark 14:43-50, Luke 22:47-53

## Jesus is treated like a common criminal and is taken to the home of the High Priest where the entire council is gathered to accuse Jesus Matt 26:57-68, Mark 14:53-65 The Sanhedrin hold an illegal trial on the night of Passover. Mark 14:58



## The disciples have fled but Simon Peter came close to listen in on what was happening to his Lord. Peter denies ever knowing Jesus Matt 26:69-75, Mark 14:66-72, Luke 22:54-62



## Friday

- First trial, before Annas [nightime hours]; Annas is looking for an accusation, biding time till Sanhedrin is gathered at High Priestly villa
- Second [and primary] trial before Sanhedrin, Jesus is condemned, misused
- Third trial, immediately at dawn [meanwhile, Peter denies Jesus a third time; Jesus looks upon him]; the condemnation repeated, then Jesus taken to Romans
- Fourth trial before Pilate [till "beginning at Galilee"]
- Fifth trial before Herod [looks for miracle]
- 6th trial before Pilate
  - Jesus is scourged; the city cries, "Crucify Him or we will tell Rome!"
  - Jesus is finally turned over to be crucified
  - Jesus mocked (Roman soldiers); crown of thorns
  - Judas hangs himself
  - Jesus bears His cross to gate on north of city and is crucified around 9 am
